# **REFLECTION – HOW WE PRAY**

Last Sunday the Scripture readings at Mass gave us that powerful image of Moses in continual prayer for victory in battle, with his arms - supported by his family - raised up to God. Thirteen hundred years later this image evoked Christ's outstretched arms nailed to the cross as he prayed to the Father for victory over human sin and death. Two thousand years after that, the priest at Mass similarly addresses the Father in prayer with his own arms raised up – supported by his parish family. Today's readings continue to develop our approach to prayer. They present us with the famous story contrasting the proud Pharisee, who sits at the front of the synagogue and congratulates himself on how wonderful he is, and the humble tax collector who stands at the back of the church and acknowledges his unworthiness as a sinner. The tax collector's praver is clearly the more acceptable to God. But neither the pharisee nor the tax collector are truly the praver model for us. It is obviously no good congratulating oneself like the pharisee. But it is also no good paralysing oneself by feeling unworthy of being in God's presence. We have all at some point felt like the tax collector; we are all unworthy of God's grace. But grace is a free gift from God which is given to us regardless of our worthiness. It is for us to accept it, thank God for it, and then to sit with confidence among God's people. Yes, we must remain humble, eschewing pride and self-congratulation. But we must combine humility with confidence in our faith and the love and mercy of God - confidence and pride in what Christ has done for us. We are proud of Christ, not of ourselves. That is enough to give us the courage to go out and tell the world about the beauty of Christ.

#### Thought for the week

We must not let our unworthiness paralyse us and keep us away from Mass and the Eucharist. We must combine humility with confidence so that we can proclaim the Good News to others.

Classes for both children and parents (separately) will be held after the 10 am Mass every Sunday except holidays from 11.15am to 12.15pm. The First Holy Communion Mass will be held in May or June 2023. Further details on the application form.

Application forms for Confirmation are now available in the church porch and on the parish website. The programme is suitable for young people between the ages of 14 and 18. Those interested please approach me. The course will start in January with the Confirmation ceremony in October 2023.
