#### **REFLECTION – THE REAL CHESSINGTON WORLD OF ADVENTURES!**

The Scripture readings today teach us that we must take a risk for Christ knowing that the "King of the world will raise us up to live forever" (2 Maccabees 7). There are no half measures. We accept the adventure of faith, hope and love. We are children of God, destined to live with him into eternity. We must be patient witnesses to the Resurrection. We are not cultural Catholics who come to Mass simply to feel comfortable that we are doing what our families and our ancestors have always done. We are not seeking political, social or economic advantage in this world. On the contrary, we are likely to be misunderstood, ridiculed and, yes, even "cancelled!" No – we come to St Catherine's to focus on Christ who humbled himself to become one of us and who died to save us from sin and death and then to rise in glory. It was a roller coaster journey. We come to Mass to experience for ourselves that journey of adventure towards eternal life through Jesus Christ. That adventure requires our patient trust in God; it requires our love for one another in this community of beautiful souls; it requires us to love all people, believers and unbelievers, those who care for us and those who try to hurt us. That makes St Catherine's the real Chessington world of adventures – adventures in faith, in hope and in love. The Saducees in the Gospel of Luke do not believe in the resurrection and afterlife. Their adventure is cut short. They try to neutralise Jesus with their tortuous argument, but Christ turns their argument on its head. Through the ups and downs of this roller coaster journey, Christ is with us second by second. We do not fear. The Lord will give us strength and protect us (St Paul, 2 Thess).
