# **REFLECTION: TO PRACTISING AND NON-PRACTISING CHRISTIANS ALIKE – THERE IS A WAY FORWARD!**

Today we can have a fresh start. Today, a new year begins in the Church's calendar, and we begin with Advent - the "Coming" - the First Coming of our dear Lord Jesus Christ, truly God and truly human. Today, we have a chance to bring renewal in our lives and to prepare to celebrate the incarnation - when God showed his love for us by humbling himself to take on human flesh and blood - to save us from sin and death and to show us just how beautiful human beings can be. The prophet Isaiah in today's first reading seven centuries before Christ, points to this coming of Christ the Peacemaker, but he is also pointing to a Second Coming - the end of the world as we know it - when peace will reign for ever. St Paul is also speaking of this second coming to warn us to be ready. He explains how we must prepare: "The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon - let us give up all the things we prefer to do under cover of the dark.... Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ." Paul communicates a sense of urgency, because time is running out for all of us (Romans 13: 11-14). Paul singles out sins of the flesh, as well private jealousies and negative thoughts about others. We may think we are not hurting others if we keep our negative feelings to ourselves, or if we sin privately (e.g. through pornography), or if we sin with someone else by mutual consent. But there is no such thing as private sin. Sin cannot be contained. What damages one person damages those around him or her. We must heed Paul's words and act upon them and follow Christ's teaching through his Church, for in Matthew's Gospel Jesus gives us a severe warning: "stay awake.... you too must stand ready because the Son of Man (Jesus Christ) is coming at an hour you do not expect" to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom (Isaiah's reign of eternal peace) will have no end. What is the way forward then? Make use of the Sacrament of Confession over Advent to confess our sins and renew ourselves before it's too late.

#### HOLY HOUR EVERY SATURDAY MORNING Starting on Saturday 10 December

Fr Peter writes: having consulted you over a number of weeks, I have reached the conclusion that we should go ahead and introduce a Holy Hour every Saturday morning from 9.30 am to 10.30 am to include **Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Rosary and Benediction, Confessions**. The majority of the hour will be allocated to **silent prayer**. This means that Mass will be brought forward from 9.30 am to start at 9.00 am – only on Saturdays. The weekly morning Mass time remains unchanged at 9.30am, preceded by Rosary.

Adoration is a most beautiful way to develop a personal relationship with our Lord. As one gazes at the Blessed Sacrament in silence, one cannot avoid being honest and open with Christ our Saviour who reads our hearts; one cannot hide away. But do not fear: however unworthy we may feel, we experience God's pure love as we reveal ourselves to him, warts and all! As we increase in selfknowledge, and humble ourselves before the Lamb of God, so our faith and knowledge of God increases.
