THROUGH JESUS, EACH ONE OF US IS IN A DIVINE AND PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP WITH AN INFINITE BEING!

This Sunday, we see in the Scripture readings God's plan continuing to unfold to save us from sin and death. God has never abandoned us, even becoming one of us to save us. We on the other hand turned away from him with such a force of pride that we find it so difficult, even now after Baptism, to feel and accept God's love through the fog of life. We find it difficult to live with our human selves and our conscience. We do not believe we truly deserve to be loved by God. We may shudder to think that God sacrificed himself for us. Instead, we console ourselves with all the wrong things. We become addicted to one thing or another. We then may hate ourselves all the more, and when we hate ourselves, we suppress our conscience and we begin to hate others, our brothers and sisters, even our parents, our children, our husbands, our wives. Only God can save us from this destructive existence. My brothers and sisters, "lift up your hearts" and lift them up to the Lord. Today, bathed in the new and eternal covenant purchased by the very blood of Jesus Christ, we are free to accept and cherish God's love for each one of us. We can appreciate how he has prepared humanity to be loved so that we may walk with God again in an even closer relationship than our first parents. Yes, there is so much that remains a mystery to us, but what do we expect? - we are in a relationship with an infinite being, infinite in every way, infinite in love, infinite in truth, infinite in understanding and mercy. Just as he prepared Mary, Joseph, John the Baptist and his parents, Zachariah and Elizabeth, so God is preparing us through the Sacraments to welcome Christ into our hearts, and to spread his love across the world.
