Central to our planning should be to implement the vision set by our Archbishop John Wilson who wants Southwark to be a MISSIONARY DIOCESE. None of this is easy. It is very much a question of whether we truly believe in Jesus Christ as true God and true man, and acquiring the tools to tell others about him.

## BUILDING THE KINGDOM OF GOD FR PETER AND THE PEOPLE MAKE PROMISES TOGETHER AT THE MASS OF INDUCTION

From the Rite of Induction Mass on 18 February

The new Parish Priest kneels before the Bishop, placing his right hand on the Book of the Gospels, he makes his Profession of Faith according to the usual formula. This is then signed by both the Parish Priest and the Bishop.

**Bishop**: It is the duty of the Priest to proclaim the word of God. He must study the Bible and meditate on its message; believe what he reads; teach what he believes and practise what he teaches. Are you willing to co-operate with your Bishop in preaching Christ in season and out of season, explaining to all the Word of God?

**Priest**: I am, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: People of this Parish of Chessington and Hook, we are called to preach Christ by the witness of a good life and to hand on the faith to our children. Are you willing to do this?

People: We are, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: The Priest gathers together the People of God for prayer and sustains them as they go forth to carry out the mission of the Church to the world. Are you ready to pray with the people, as well as for them, and to lead and encourage them in their apostolate in the world?

Priest: I am, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: People of this Parish, you share in the work of the Church. Will you work and pray together in love, seeking through prayer and service to grow in the knowledge of the Faith and to make the Gospel known throughout the world?

People: We will, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: The priest cares for the people by celebrating with them the Sacraments. When he baptizes, he brings men and women into the family of God; he witnesses their marriage vows; in the Sacrament of Reconciliation he forgives sins in the name of Christ and His Church; with holy oil, he strengthens and consoles the sick and the dying. Will you prepare your people by wise instruction to receive the Sacraments worthily and fruitfully?

Priest: I will, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: People of this parish, will you co-operate in preparing for the reception of the Sacraments?

People: We will, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: It is the priest's privilege and duty to celebrate the Sacrifice of the Mass to proclaim the Lord's death until he comes, and to feed the people with the Body and Blood of Christ. Are you willing to celebrate the Mass faithfully for the living and dead as the Church ordains for the glory and the sanctification of Christ's people?

Priest: I am, with the help of God.

**Bishop**: People of this parish, will you faithfully participate in the Sacred Mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood so that the Church may be built up as the body of Christ?

People: We will, with the help of God
