CONFIRMATION AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CLASSES RESUME NEXT FRIDAY AND SUNDAY

These courses will now resume. The FHC course will recommence on Sunday 26 February and the Confirmation course on Friday 24 February. As I have mentioned, for the first time we are trialing the SYCAMORE course for Confirmation, produced by Fr Stephen Wang, the author of the pamphlet "A Way of Life for Young Catholics" (Catholic Truth Society – on display in the church lobby) with which many of you are now familiar. If SYCAMORE proceeds well, we can set up a special enquiry course for non-Catholics and lapsed-Catholics. This will be central to OUR MISSION TO SPREAD THE GOSPEL OF CHRIST, THE MISSION WE SHARE WITH OUR ARCHBISHOP JOHN WILSON AND ALL THE CLERGY IN OUR DIOCESE.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY TEAM

I have been approached by several of you to re-start the Children's Liturgy Team in our parish. I would be delighted to do this. I would suggest we initially trial Children's Liturgy one or two Sundays every month at 10 am. As usual we shall have to make sure that we have all the safeguarding measures in place and that the volunteers are given support in imparting their faith to the children. We cannot start this worthy initiative until we have enough volunteers to form a rota so that the adults and teenagers involved in helping the children do not miss the Homily every Sunday!
