OUR LENTEN MISSION – JESUS OUR SHEPHERD

Fr Peter writes: last week I joined other priests ordained in the last eight years for an evening with our Archbishop John Wilson. It was a joyful evening, beginning with a Holy Hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament followed by drinks and a chat with the Archbishop and then supper. Our new auxiliary bishop, Philip Moger was also present. The Archbishop urged his priests, some of whom were ordained only last July, to deepen their prayer life, to spend more time with the Lord and to abandon themselves totally in heart and mind to Christ. It was very inspiring and vital to a priest's ability to be a shepherd to his people in the parish and beyond. I therefore pass on the Archbishop's message to all of us to do what we can to renew ourselves this Lent, to examine our conscience, to come to confession, to deny ourselves certain pleasures, to double our efforts to help others - in short to deepen our love for God and for one another.

Therefore, this is the time to devote more of ourselves to Christ. Come to **Stations of the Cross** once a week (Sundays 5 pm and Fridays after 9.30 am Mass). Come to an **extra Mass** during the week. Come to **Holy Hour** (9.30 am, Saturdays). Come to **Confession** and be reconciled with God. *"Come to me all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest."*

CHILDREN'S LITURGY COMING SOON

I am grateful to the three responsible teenagers / young adults who have volunteered to run Children's Liturgy during Mass. That means taking the children to the hall after the Opening Prayer to go over the Bible readings with them and then bringing them back after the Prayers of Intercession. We need three volunteers per Mass, so this team will cover one Sunday a month at the 10 am Mass. I would be most grateful for another three volunteers to enable us to hold a second 10 am Mass with Children's Liturgy each month. As usual we shall have to make sure that we have all the safeguarding measures in place and that the volunteers are given support in imparting their faith to the children. Please do come forward and volunteer for this important ministry. There are two types of roles: one is the catechist role to explain the Scripture readings of the day. The other is to provide support (e.g. helping with any artwork, taking children to the toilet etc) and playing a safeguarding role. Both the catechist and the support roles require safeguarding checks to be made and clearance to work with children. NB SAFEGUARDING: DON'T DELAY TO APPLY as safeguarding clearance can take weeks.

Some weeks ago we drew your attention to the formation of Caritas Southwark, the Archbishop's umbrella organization to coordinate charitable works in the Archdiocese and across the Archdiocese of Southwark. **Today the Archbishop** sends us all a pastoral letter about this new initiative and invites us to join him at Mass in the Cathedral on 18 March and afterwards in the Amigo Hall next door. Our challenge at St Catherine's is to form a parish team which concerns itself with putting faith into action, and reaching out to the poor and needy to bring them our love and support.

REFLECTION ON SCRIPTURE PASSAGES ARE WE TRULY THIRSTING FOR GOD OR ARE WE SIMPLY PUTTING HIM TO THE TEST CONSTANTLY ASKING: "IS THE LORD WITH US OR NOT?"

In the beautiful Gospel of John, the fourth Gospel, we get a sense of the relationship of Jesus with the Father and with the Holy Spirit. Jesus is committed to doing the will of the Father, and the Father sends the Holy Spirit through Jesus to help us do the will of the Father in our own lives. In John's Gospel, Jesus gradually reveals the Holy Spirit, the Spirit he would reveal fully only after his resurrection. A key feature of John's Gospel are the Seven Signs or miracles which show how Jesus focuses on a person as an individual and brings them from darkness and confusion to the light of faith. This is what Jesus does in this famous and beautiful story of the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well - the second of the seven signs. Her life had become drv and lifeless. At first she is resistant and dismissive. but Jesus persists until she understands that he is the Messiah come to save her and that the water of eternal life, truth and fulfilment is the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit does the same for each one of us - brings us to the light of Christ and refreshes us and our faith.

Thought for the week - If we are searching for God, he is searching for us a hundred times more.

APPEAL FOR ACCOMMODATION – OLENA

Olena is the mother of Inna and the grandmother of Lillia - the mother and daughter who were let down by their sponsor under the "Homes for Ukraine" scheme (HfU) but were then found accommodation. They are happy and thankful and they brought the parish a very large bag of biscuits for us for our Sunday coffee and Confirmation evenings. Olena had already secured a place in a good home, but the host is moving, so Olena needs a new home here in Chessington from 1 May for six months. CAN YOU HELP? Under the HfU scheme you would receive £350 per month. Olena is 60, a widow and a parishioner. She was forced to flee Ukraine as her city was being bombed by the Russians. Olena buys her own food and just needs a bedroom and access to a kitchen or cooking facilities. She is out most of the day doing cleaning jobs. Her current host speaks highly of Olena.
