Sacrament of Healing - It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Please try to give notice if at all possible and don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic. "DON'T LOSE SIGHT OF THE PERSON IN THE REFUGEE DEBATE" SAYS OUR ARCHBISHOP JOHN WILSON

Archbishop Wilson recently visited Dover in his Archdiocese and paid tribute to the work of those working at the lifeboat station there:

"We have people before us who are in desperate need. And if we lose sight of the desperate need of the people, we lose sight of our conscience as a country. So it was incredible to hear the testimonies of those who work on the lifeboats in Dover. They simply said, 'Our mission has always been and will always be to save people in danger at sea. We don't ask who they are or where they're from.' I was really, really impressed by that." Pointing to a fundamental truth of the Gospel, Archbishop Wilson stressed that the Christian response is to reach out in love: "There are issues that need humane resolution, not simply isolating people or cutting them off or rejecting them or transporting them elsewhere. That doesn't help anybody. Global solutions need countries to speak to each other and they need partnership and they need a compassion that puts into practice real solutions, not simply knee-jerk reactions that seemingly solve a problem at the expense of the dignity of human life."

APPEAL FOR ACCOMMODATION – OLENA

Olena is the mother of Inna and the grandmother of Lillia - the mother and daughter who were let down by their sponsor under the "Homes for Ukraine" scheme (HfU) but were then found accommodation. They are happy and thankful and they brought the parish a very large bag of biscuits for us for our Sunday coffee and Confirmation evenings. Olena had already secured a place in a good home, but the host is moving, so Olena needs a new home here in Chessington from 1 May for six months. CAN YOU HELP? Under the HfU scheme you would receive £350 per month. Olena is 60, a widow and a parishioner. She was forced to flee Ukraine as her city was being bombed by the Russians. Olena buys her own food and just needs a bedroom and access to a kitchen or cooking facilities. She is out most of the day doing cleaning jobs. Her current host speaks highly of Olena.

THE RESURRECTION BECKONS BUT FIRST WE MUST SHARE IN THE SUFFERING OF CHRIST

Just as we rejoice that Jesus has raised Lazarus from the dead, we have a sense of foreboding, that this act of mercy hastens the crucifixion of Jesus himself. From this 5th Sunday of Lent, the statues, images and crucifixes are covered in purple cloth to remind us of the impending crisis we are about to witness. Like the Jews who followed Jesus, we begin to prepare for the unthinkable - that Jesus, the world's only hope, is going to be killed by the powerful and spiritually blind. We need to immerse ourselves in the suffering of Christ, his Passion, his agony in the Garden, his betrayal and brutal trial, his torture by whipping and piercing with a crown of thorns into his skull, his carrying the cross to Calvary, his nailing on the Cross and his horrible death. We need to continue our journey with Christ and immerse ourselves in his own suffering. Therefore, come to Stations of the Cross to join Christ in his hour of need, in his suffering. Watch with him. Do not abandon him. We are given glimpses not only of Christ's destiny but also our own. Three Apostles witness the Transfiguration, therefore aware that there is an afterlife. Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead points to Christ's own resurrection. The Samaritan woman at the well and the Man born Blind whom we have encountered over the last two weeks were reborn, given new life in this world. No one is so lost or so dead in this life that God cannot reach them and raise them. We have been BORN AGAIN.

HOLY WEEK 2-9 APRIL

PALM SUNDAY – usual Mass times. Jesus rides on a donkey into Jerusalem and is cheered by ecstatic crowds. We here the Passion Narrative of our Lord. MAUNDY THURSDAY 8 pm - Mass of the Lord's Passover Supper at which Jesus washed the feet of the Apostles to signify that he came to serve, not to be served, after which he instituted the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. Fr Peter will be washing the feet of twelve men at this Mass. The stripping of the altar and the transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in the Sacred Heart Chapel ends the service to signify we have lost Jesus. GOOD FRIDAY - will begin at 9 am at St Paul's CofE church with a Walk of Witness with our Anglican and Methodist brothers and sisters. The Good Friday service marking the passion and crucifixion of our Lord Jesus will be at 3 pm at which the Passion Narrative of St John will be read, followed by universal intercessions and the veneration of the Cross, the distribution of Holy Communion (but it is not a Mass). There will be Stations of the Cross at 7 pm at St Catherine's, followed by a period of adoration ending with Compline (Night Prayer) at 10 pm.

HOLY SATURDAY – Vigil Mass of the Lord's Resurrection – 8 pm. This will begin with the liturgy of the light of Christ outside the church, followed by the Easter Proclamation, several readings from Scripture, and after the homily the baptism, reception and confirmation of new Catholics.

This is a stunning sequence of events in the our faith and I urge you all to participate at the services.
