THIS IS HOLY WEEK

THE MOST IMPORTANT WEEK IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

PALM SUNDAY – PASSION SUNDAY - usual Mass times. Jesus rides on a donkey into Jerusalem and is cheered by ecstatic crowds. We will hear the Gospel Passion Narrative of St Matthew.

MAUNDY THURSDAY 8 pm – Mass of the Lord's Passover Supper at which Jesus washed the feet of the Apostles to signify that he came to serve, not to be served. Fr Peter will be washing the feet of twelve men at the Maundy Mass to indicate his service, after which we will celebrate Christ's institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Sacred Priesthood. the stripping of the altar and the transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose in the Sacred Heart Chapel. There will be a period of adoration until Compline (Night Prayer) at 10 pm.

GOOD FRIDAY – will begin at **9 am** at St Paul's CofE church with a **Walk of Witness** with our Anglican and Methodist brothers and sisters (see below). The **Good Friday service** marking the passion and crucifixion of our Lord Jesus will be at **3 pm** at which the Gospel Passion Narrative of St John will be read, followed by universal intercessions and the veneration of the Cross, the distribution of Holy Communion (but it is not a Mass).

There will be Stations of the Cross at 7 pm.

HOLY SATURDAY – Vigil Mass of the Lord's Resurrection – 8 pm. This will begin with the Liturgy of the Light of Christ outside the church, followed by the Easter Proclamation, several readings from Scripture, and after the homily the baptism, reception and confirmation of new Catholics.

EASTER SUNDAY – 8 am and 10 am (no 6 pm Mass)

This is a stunning sequence of events in our faith and I urge you all to participate at the services.

CONFESSIONS – HOLY SATURDAY 9.30 AM – 11.00 AM TRY TO COME TO ALL THE SERVICES – IT IS A PILGRIMAGE IN ITSELF. TRY NOT TO WORK IN HOLY WEEK IF AT ALL POSSIBLE! MAKE AN OFFERING OF YOURSELF TO GOD. USE IT AS A RETREAT. PRAY IN SILENCE. SPEND TIME BY YOUR CRUCIFIX. ENTER INTO THE MYSTERY OF CHRIST'S CONQUEST OF SIN AND DEATH THROUGH HIS RESURRECTION!

MEETING OF THE PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE

A parish priest is obliged under Canon Law to establish a Finance Committee and to meet with the Committee as necessary. This ensures that the priest feels supported and that there is independent scrutiny of the parish finances. I asked the existing members of the Committee to stay on for the time being. They are: Carolyn Cooper-Burrows, Peter Brownrigg, Howard Brinkworth, Vera Parfitt, our parish secretary. The Committee met last Wednesday. We discussed an overview of parish income and expenditure, taking account of the big expense items so far. We are left with just £10,000 in our bank accounts together with a generous £15,000 loan which we must pay back over time. As I have mentioned to you before, the parish is solvent, with income exceeding normal expenditure. However, we are going to have to spend heavily over and above the normal day-to-day parish expenses. Some of the expenses are to beautify the church and the estate as I have mentioned at our three parish meetings. But others are absolutely vital to maintain the integrity of our buildings. I am particularly concerned about the church's rotting window frames, the rotting gutters, soffits and fascias and the damp wall on the right-front side of the church where all the water accumulates after heavy rain. We shall engage a surveyor to come and take stock of the estate to help build a five-year plan of likely expenses so that we can raise money accordingly and plan ahead. However, it is clear that in the short term we shall have to borrow more. In future I shall advertise the date of the Finance Committee meeting in case you want to raise anything with the members beforehand as an agenda item.

REFLECTION – PALM SUNDAY

Today we ourselves join Jesus in his journey to the Holy Temple of Jerusalem, to the heights of his Father in heaven. Today, we begin our pilgrimage of Holy Week having prepared and purified ourselves over the five weeks of Lent. Let us never be discouraged if we have fallen along the journey. Jesus is there with us to pick us up, encourage us and love us to the end. We are in good hands. I ask you all to enter solemnly into the mystery of Holy Week, during which we go from the depths of despair to the height of joy in the resurrection. At all times, Jesus did the will of God, and that is what we are called to do as well.

Nothing makes us happier than to know we are doing the will of God. Christ is our model.
