NEW SACRAMENTAL COURSE HERE TEENAGERS' COMMUNION - WE LOVE YOU!

I am aware that there are older children and teenagers who were unable in the past for whatever reason to attend a First Holy Communion / First Confession course. We are therefore starting on Saturday 17 June at 11 am a new weekly course to meet the needs of these young people. This course may also lead to the Sacrament of Confirmation. The purpose of this notice is to invite all those young people who fall into this category to join the course. Parishioners may know of other teenagers who have stopped coming to Mass, because they have not been received into Holy Communion or for some other reason. Please do tell them that Jesus and his Church want them and love them and embrace them and they are most welcome. Adults who have not received First Holy Communion or Confirmation can join our adult course known as RCIA. Please contact Fr Peter now about both courses. They will be fun.

REFLECTION - THE APOSTLES APPOINT DEACONS - ARE YOU BEING CALLED TO BE A DEACON?

Last week the emphasis was on promoting vocations to the Sacred Priesthood instituted by Jesus at the Last Supper (Maundy Thursday). This week in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the focus shifts to Deacons. There are three "orders" in the Catholic Clergy: Bishops (the successors of the Apostles), Priests, and Deacons. A man is first ordained a deacon, then a priest and then a very small number are ordained Bishops. We see how the Apostles had lost their fear and mind-fog at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended upon them and filled them with gifts of wisdom, fortitude etc. They went out immediately to preach the Word, the Good News of the Gospel, that Jesus was the Messiah, that he had been crucified by the Jewish authorities and the Romans but had risen from the dead. Faith in the Word spread rapidly, so much so that the Apostles could not cope with all the work in the early Christian community in Jerusalem. The Hellenists (Greek-speaking immigrants from various Jewish settlements throughout the Roman world) complained that the Hebrews (Aramaic-speaking locals in Palestine) were getting the lion's share of the Apostles' attention leaving the Hellenist widows without enough material support. The Apostles decided to find seven men "of good reputation and full of the spirit" to consecrate as deacons by the "laying on of hands" to help the widows so that they themselves could spend more time in "prayer and the ministry of the Word." What came to be known as the Permanent Diaconate was open to both single and married men. The ministry and vocation of the Permanent Deacon was revived after the Second Vatican Council. There are currently around eighty men in our Diocese who are serving as Permanent Deacons. Their ministry goes well beyond helping widows and the marginalized. They are members of the clergy and are ministers of the Word (preaching and teaching), the Altar (with a focus on the Eucharist) and Charity. They are ordinary ministers of Baptism and Holy Communion and conduct weddings and funerals and support parish life. PICK UP A LEAFLET FROM THE LOBBY AND CONSIDER IF YOU ARE BEING CALLED!
