PARISH CENSUS TODAY

We have created a new Parish Registration Form for our records and we would be grateful if parishioners could complete a form today at Mass on a voluntary basis. The forms will be made available at the 8 am and 10 am Masses today and at the 6 pm Mass next Sunday. We will repeat the process over the next few weeks to ensure everyone has a chance to complete the form. I am aware that the parish has continued to grow the further away we move from the COVID pandemic. There are many people in the parish who have not formally registered and our records are now out of date.

The purpose of the census is to help me be a better servant in my pastoral work on your behalf and to take care of your spiritual needs. I am also keen to be able to communicate securely by e-mail with the whole parish as we begin to move into the next phase of **parish renewal**. After discussion at our recent parish meeting about the future of the parish, we decided to conduct a parish census and also run a short survey to hear your thoughts about the parish and where we want to be as we take part in the Archbishop's drive to make us a **missionary diocese and a missionary parish** (known as "Called to bear fruit." There will be a more formal survey of the people at a later date as part of this "Called to bear fruit" umbrella initiative.

To handle the precious Body of Christ one must live the sacramental life.

REFLECTION ON TODAY'S READINGS AT MASS

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks to the world in parables, because those who yearn to know and bring themselves to God, their creator, will be able to understand the true meaning and follow Christ's teaching. Those who are determined to be spiritually blind, by following their own will rather than God's Will, cannot understand. Jesus amplifies his message for the Apostles by giving them his personal commentary on the parable. We need to read his parable and commentary many times and examine our conscience and so decide what type of soil we have prepared for the seed of God's Word. If we are the "rich soil" in which the seed flourishes, we need to prove it by our fruits, by the size of the harvest. We are called to bear fruit. As we know, "the harvest is rich but the labourers are few." St Paul reminds us that we are children of God, who is Abba, literally "our Daddy" "our Father." We are not his slaves and we are not made to be slaves to sin and to decadence. Let us do everything to live the sacramental life, avoid sinful thoughts, deeds and words, examine our consciences daily and bring in a rich harvest for God our loving Father.
