Sacrament of Healing - It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Please try to give notice if at all possible and don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic. Sacrament of Ordination and consecration to the sacred Priesthood and Religious life - please speak to Fr Peter who will connect you with our vocations director.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THAT SINKING FEELING!

I'm sure we have all experienced what St Peter is going through in today's Gospel as he tries to walk on water towards Christ. We want to trust in Jesus and in his promises. There are times when we are full of confidence. We recognize Christ and give him our hearts. Then suddenly it can all evaporate. We become afraid, we lose confidence, usually because of anxieties or of our sinfulness and our feelings of unworthiness to be in the presence of God. But Jesus does not condemn us for our sinfulness or for doubting him. He came to call sinners, not the just. He continues to help us, to choose us to be his disciples. Just like he never left St Peter, so he never leaves us. Note the encouraging words of our Archbishop John Wilson -see the right hand column: Jesus "invites you into his presence. He calls you personally by name. Do you believe this? He calls you not at some point in the future, he calls you not when you think your life is perfect. No. He calls you tonight - now - to encounter the love of His Sacred Heart and the healing of His divine mercy......'

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023 IMPORTANT PERSONAL MESSAGE TO EACH ONE OF US FROM OUR ARCHBISHOP

Archbishop John Wilson encourages World Youth Day pilgrims to go deeper to respond to Christ's call

"Dear friends, the most important words I can say to you this evening are these: The Lord Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world, is calling you. And He is calling you to meet Him, to know Him and to love Him. He is calling you to be strengthened by Him to serve others. Tonight, dear friends, we receive a royal summons from a mighty king, the Lord Jesus. He invites you into his presence. He calls you personally by name. Do you believe this? **He calls you not at some point in the future, he calls you not when you think your life is perfect. No.** He calls you tonight – now – to encounter the love of His Sacred Heart and the healing of His divine mercy......

Dear friends, we are called to greatness. You are called to greatness in the Christian life. You are called not to live on the surface, but to go deep – deep into the heart of Jesus. To go deep into what it means to be a disciple. To go deep into living the Gospel as a witness to Christ. You were not created to live on the surface, living superficially, without purpose, without meaning. In the words of the great English Cardinal and Saint, John Henry Newman, you were created for some definite purpose. You have a mission, you have a call, and it is unique to you. Our life of faith is that of ongoing conversion. Faith takes us deeper into the meaning of our existence where our life makes sense with Christ, in relationship with Him. Why? Because he is sweetness for your soul in His love and in His mercy.

So, dear friends, wherever you are in your faith, the Lord Jesus is calling you to take a next step, a new step, a deeper step. **Are you ready for this? Are you sure?** Reading the Gospels page after page, we meet people who were called by Christ, first, to make an act of faith and an act of trust. To open themselves more fully and more deeply to His love and mercy. The biggest journey we have to make is from our head knowledge to our heart knowledge. Down the centuries, all the saints have dug deep to find the sweetness of Christ. And the question is, will you? **Will you live superficially or do you want to go deeper? This is the question.**

My friends, the Holy Spirit is here amongst us. The Lord Jesus is calling you to deeper relationship with Him because He is alive. He is alive in the world, He is alive in the Church, He is alive in you, by the Holy Spirit. **The Lord Jesus is here for you in his sacraments and in His word.** The Lord Jesus is calling you, will you respond?"

Eucharistic Adoration and Confession -Fr Peter writes: our inspiring Archbishop ended his talk by extolling to young and old the spiritual rewards that come from Eucharistic Adoration and from Confession. These are two aspects of our religious practice which we emphasise all the time here at St Catherine of Siena – and for good reason: adoration of the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist and regularly making use of the Sacrament of Confession enables us **to dig deep, to listen to God and to find our mission.**
