WHAT IS THE PARISH WORKING ON RIGHT NOW?

As you can see, I am not around this Sunday. I am working with parishioners on a number of projects relating to the parish. I will be with you again from next Saturday. We are working on:

- Developing several **parish teams** in addition to the two teams mentioned further down. These teams will cover every aspect of our parish life so that the burden of work never falls on one or two people. I am sure you all welcome this.
- a **parish survey** to put to you soon so that we have a good idea of the needs of the parish.
- getting initial quotes for work that needs to be done, such as the church windows, gutters, soffits, fascias, redecoration and refurbishment of the parish Presbytery, inside and outside, a replacement parish sign at the entrance to the car park pending a general overhaul of the façade of the parish estate from the road.
- the re-launch of next year's sacramental programmes - Communion for children and parents, Confirmation for teenagers, RCIA for new Catholics, and the possibility of a short course for current parishioners attending Mass.
- crucially the development of a parish team to spearhead catechesis, evangelisation and formation of disciples among us all. These three areas are of course interconnected and feed off each other. All 175 parishes in the Archdiocese are working with the Archbishop's Agency for Evangelisation and Catechesis (AEC) to develop parish plans for mission. This is an exciting time in the history of the parish but it will take us time and effort to mobilise us all so as better to learn our faith, express our faith with confidence and welcome others into our faith. The Holy Spirit will guide us. He is the spiritual director of our beautiful parish.
- the introduction of more **liturgical music** at the 10 am Mass, supported by an expanded choir.
- the establishment of a funded **Caritas Southwark** group to carry out charitable works;
- the resumption of **Children's Liturgy** after the three year COVID hiatus.
- the development of a **Youth Ministry Group** for our teenagers.
- a fully trained and expanded Altar Server team.
- a team of **Extraordinary Ministers** of the Eucharist to take Holy Communion to the sick and those unable to get to church for any reason.
- I am also spending some time getting to know the schools in the area which many of our children attend. I have had the pleasure of celebrating Mass at **Richard Challoner School** for the 6th Form at the start of their school year, and on Friday I celebrated Mass for *Holy Cross Day* at **The Holy Cross School**, New Malden.

I am grateful to those who have volunteered to join the two critical parish teams we must establish right away.

ARTS & BUILDINGS TEAM - to advise me on the replacement of rotting windows with double glazed stained glass windows, and the installation of PVC soffits, fascias and gutters. We need a mix of people with practical and artistic qualities. More volunteers please.

SOCIAL & FUNDRAISING TEAM - to run activities to pay for the new works.

I shall lead the *Arts & Buildings team*. One of you should lead the social and fundraising team, or perhaps two of you in partnership. More volunteers please.
