CALL FOR PRAYER AND FASTING FOR PEACE IN THE HOLY LAND TUESDAY 17 OCTOBER – DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE SPECIAL MASS AT 6.30 PM AT ST CATHERINE'S FOLLOWED BY ROSARY AND EXPOSITION

Our Bishops of England and Wales urge us to pray for peace and reconciliation as we witness the horrific events in the Holy Land. They say: "As we look on at the humanitarian catastrophe in the Holy Land with hearts that cry out to God for an end to war and violence, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, His Beatitude Pierbattista Pizzaballa, has called for a day of fasting, abstinence, and prayer for peace and reconciliation. Inviting all parishes and religious communities to pray on **Tuesday**, **17 October**, Patriarch Pizzaballa encouraged prayer times to be organised with Eucharistic adoration and the recitation of the Rosary to Our Blessed Virgin Mary. We are organising a special Mass (6.30 pm – 7 pm) followed by Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament ending with Benediction (7 pm to 7.30 pm).
