CHRIST IS THE SERVANT KING

AND JUST AS JESUS HAS SERVED US SO WE MUST SERVE ONE ANOTHER IF WE ARE TO ENTER HIS KINGDOM

Dear Brothers and Sisters - Who is Christ for us? Surely he is the God who humbled himself to become one of us out of pure love, to die for us sinners, who calls us "friends" and shares our sufferings and joys, who heals us with his intense love and his divine truth, who weeps for us as he wept for his friend Lazarus, who shares meals with us and our families, who said to us that he was giving us his very body and blood to sustain and enable each one of us to enjoy a deeply personal relationship with him in the Holy Eucharist. Why on earth then does Christ need to be given the title King of the Universe? He is God after all, far greater than any king on earth. It is precisely because "my kingdom is not of this world" that he shows us the true kingship which earthly rulers should copy, but don't. He is truly the King of the Universe, the source of all power on earth, who nonetheless humbles himself to serve us in order to shepherd us into his Kingdom. The Solemnity of the Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI as recently as 1925 to counter the rise of atheistic secularist regimes, the lies of fascism and communism. In Christ, love and truth come together as in no other king and in no other kingdom. He himself tells Pontius Pilate (John 18:37): "Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice." When we encounter Jesus in the Gospels and through the Holy Spirit, we see that he stands for truth – the objective truth of our existence - and that he stands for love, love of the Father and love of one another. Uniquely, truth and love cannot be separated in Christ's kingship. Nor can they be separated in our Christian lives. That means we cannot enter Christ's Kingdom unless we truly love and serve each other, those who are poor, sick, afflicted, hungry, dejected, imprisoned, marginalised......
