ADVENT – WE'VE GOT IT ALL WRONG! TAKE BACK CONTROL! STAY AWAKE TO WELCOME THE SAVIOUR!

Advent is not the journey of comfort and joy leading up to the crescendo of Christmas Day. It is not a time for revelry, drink and getting tipsy. It is not a sequence of office parties and the like. By the time we get to Christmas are we completely fed up with Christmas and couldn't care less about the arrival of the Saviour of the world? The orthodox have got it absolutely right: celebrate Christmas at Epiphany, after we have absorbed the nativity and the incarnation. Celebrate it with great awe and joy and love, that the truth has come to dwell among us, the Word has become flesh. Capitalism, lined with greed and envy, has made Advent a series of mini material Christmasses. Comfort and joy in December, you say? I can already feel your fatigue, or your expectant fatigue just at the thought of what you have to go through in December. I wonder if it is possible to take back control and to turn back to God and away from materialism, from mammon (a Syrian deity of wealth and riches). Is there any chance we might be able to turn back to God? Repeatedly Jesus in the Gospels tells us to stay awake and prepare. During Advent we prepare both to welcome the birth of the Christ-child God humbling himself to become human - and also the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus, who will return to judge the living and the dead, and his Kingdom will have no end. Perhaps we should start with our schools and hold nativity plays and bazaars after Christmas, once we have absorbed the reality of the incarnation? For us Christians, we are offered an opportunity to opt out of the rat race and emphasize the centrality of our faith. PLEASE STAY AWAY and consider doing something extra, like attending Holy Hour, Mass on one weekday as well as Sunday. Please prepare by going to **Confession**. Do a regular examination of conscience. Consider **fasting** and be generous with your money to others. Take time away from social media. Learn some extra prayers. Offer the Rosary to God. And to the RECENTLY CONFIRMED – LET THE HOLY SPIRIT INSPIRE YOU. THANK AND PRAISE GOD.
