# BE FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT! BE FILLED WITH HOPE, LOVE & TRUTH! JOHN THE BAPTIST POINTS US TO JESUS THE SON OF GOD

Perhaps after this first week of Advent as we have been examining our conscience, our life, our relationships, we may be feeling a bit dejected, a bit down, with the conclusion, "could do better." If you are feeling a bit down, well done - that's not a bad indicator at all of your desire for holiness! - We can all do better. LIFT UP YOUR HEARTS - there are grounds for great hope. We await our Lord and our God, Jesus Christ, to come to take us with him to eternal happiness with the Father and the Holy Spirit. He has conquered sin and death and prepared an eternal paradise for us. That is the Good News which our redeemer brings to the world at Christmas through his incarnation. The readings from Scripture express this hope. And in these two middle Sundays, this Sunday and next Sunday, the focus shifts to John the Baptist and the two comings of Christ. The Gospel of Mark and the prophet Isaiah proclaim joyously the first coming of the Messiah, the Christ child at Christmas – the beauty of the incarnation. Mark and all the Gospels go back to Isaiah: "A voice cries in the wilderness: prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight." All four Gospels identify this voice as that of John the Baptist. And John the Baptist is the great figure of Advent. He is more than a prophet. He is the final prophet, and in him the Holy Spirit concludes speaking through the prophets. John the Baptist echoes Isaiah and proclaims that the consolation for Israel – for the world – for us – is imminent and he has come to be a witness to the truth and the love of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Whereas John baptised with water, Jesus would baptise with water and the Holy Spirit. In other words, it is God who baptises us.

TAKE HEART, BE FILLED WITH HOPE, PERSEVERE IN YOUR EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE, IN YOUR PRAYERS, AND STAY AWAKE. DO NOT SLEEP WALK THROUGH LIFE!
