Sacrament of Confirmation - annual course for baptised young Catholics - please apply to Fr Peter Sacrament of Marriage – please speak to Fr Peter at least six months before the proposed wedding date. **Sacrament of Healing** – It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Please try to give notice if at all possible and don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic. Sacrament of Ordination and consecration to the sacred Priesthood and Religious life – please speak to Fr Peter who will connect you with our vocations director.

REFLECTION ON SCRIPTURE PASSAGES MIRACLES ARE NOT ENOUGH

Imagine being one of those people who followed Jesus 2000 years ago. Why are we following him around? Are we looking for miracles? Why? To make life easier for us, to spare us suffering? To help us believe in Jesus as the Messiah. Or because we love to be with Jesus, to hear his words of preaching and to learn from him how to pray to the Father and experience the Father's healing love? How we answer these questions will reflect the depth of our faith and our ability to cope with suffering. Looking for miracles is not enough to sustain us through this life. Today we have an advantage over those early followers of Jesus. We know, witnessed by so many, that God humbled himself to share in our suffering and that the greatest miracle of all was Christ's Resurrection, overcoming forever sin and death. In the same way, Jesus raises us up through the Sacraments to a new life with God – the Sacramental life. Through prayer, we raise our hearts and minds to God. That sustains us as eventually it sustained the long-suffering Job in today's Old Testament passage.
