It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic.

#### YOU CAN MAKE DONATIONS BY CARD

We have a new machine called **DONA** in the entrance hall to enable donations to be made by debit or credit card. Just tap on the screen to reveal the donation categories (e.g. Offertory, Second Collection, Clergy Support Fund etc). The first time you use DONA you will be asked for some basic identification details. After that a donation can be made in seconds. You can use it to **Gift Aid** your weekly and all other donations if you are a tax payer. It means St Catherine's can claim back from the Tax Office a further 25% of your donation. It makes sense. We will still have a cash collection but some of you will prefer to use DONA.

### REFLECTION ON THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT ARE WE TRULY LISTENING AND TRUSTING?

A theme of the Gospels, of the Good News, is that our faith brings us great comfort but also presents us with a very real challenge: that to enter the Kingdom of Heaven we must embrace suffering – we must embrace our cross just as the innocent Jesus embraced his. Too often we listen to Christ's words of comfort but resist the Cross. St Peter and the Apostles had to face this truth about embracing the Cross. They were gradually coming to accept Christ as the Messiah, but they really did not know what kind of Messiah. They thought he was an earthly Messiah, to overcome Israel's enemies. These themes come together during Lent and particularly on this second Sunday which focuses on the Transfiguration of Christ. It helps us in our faith journey through Lent to identify with the Apostles as we come to understand what Christ's mission means for each one of us. We have the benefit now of knowing that Christ rose from the dead. And that is precisely what the transfiguration is: a real visual event of the resurrected Christ mentioned by all three synoptic Gospels and by St Peter (2 Peter 1:16-21) As the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, the Apostles are offered a foretaste of the kingdom. The Transfiguration took place about a year before the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord, You will remember that a week before the Transfiguration, at Caesarea Philippi, St Peter had declared that Jesus was the Son of the living God, the Christ. But when in the next breath Jesus said he himself was destined to suffer and die at the hands of the Pharisees and Scribes, Peter could not accept it, so Christ told him off: "Get behind me Satan" - in other words, don't try to take the Cross away from me! The Apostles were dejected and depressed. They could not understand. So a week later, Christ showed the three most prominent Apostles the great reward awaiting them so as to encourage them and lift them. So we too are given a taste of heaven when we shall all be transfigured. The Feast of the Transfiguration is not until August, but the Church places this event before us today, early on in Lent, to encourage us to persevere in our Lenten journey, fasting, abstaining and carrying our own cross with love, listening to God's beloved Son.
