YOU CAN MAKE DONATIONS BY CARD

We have a new machine called **DONA** in the entrance hall to enable donations to be made by debit or credit card. Just tap on the screen to reveal the donation categories (e.g. Offertory, Second Collection, Clergy Support Fund etc). The first time you use DONA you will be asked for some basic identification details. After that a donation can be made in seconds. You can use it to Gift Aid your weekly and all other donations if you are a tax payer. It means St Catherine's can claim back from the Tax Office a further 25% of your donation. It makes sense. We will still have a cash collection but some of you will prefer to use DONA.

ACT NOW TO STOP DIY ABORTION UPTO BIRTH

Diana Johnson MP has tabled an amendment (New Clause 1) to the Government's Criminal Justice Bill. This amendment seeks to change criminal law so that "no offence is committed by a woman acting in relation to her own pregnancy" at any gestation. This means that a woman who induced her abortion at home using pills (or any other method) at any stage of pregnancy, including just before natural birth, would commit no offence. LENTEN REFLECTION WHAT IS OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD LIKE? DO WE LOVE OURSELVES MORE THAN GOD?

Many people seem to be angry with God these days, largely because their lives may not be going the way they want them to; the world is not going where they want it to go. Worse than this, many Catholics are simply lukewarm. They blow hot and cold in their relationship with God. Still worse, they are indifferent. They come first and God is an afterthought. Have they not been listening to God through all the Scriptures and the Church? Have they not been listening to his beloved Son who explained the Old Testament Scriptures to his disciples and gave us a new commandment - that we should love one another as God loves us? From the very beginning when we turned our back on God, Sacred Scripture tells us that he has been trying to bring us back to him. This is called Salvation History – and through Lent so far we have been treated to the Scripture texts at Mass which show the intimate relationship of love and truth which God wants with humanity. God made great covenants - the closest possible of bonds - with Noah after the Flood; with Abraham c2000 years before Christ; with Moses c1350 years before Christ, with David a thousand years before Christ, and finally the covenant established by Christ himself - the new and eternal and final covenant bought with the very flesh and blood of our Lord Jesus at the Last Supper and on the Cross at Calvary. As we hear in John's Gospel today, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." God did not have to save us. God did not have to sacrifice himself for us, but uniquely he has. He has made it possible for us to move out of the darkness of sin and into the light of truth and love (John 3.20) "for every one who does evil hates the light... but he who does what is true comes to the light. that it may be clearly seen..." Nicodemus the wellmeaning Pharisee came to see Jesus in the darkness of the night. His mind was closed and he was unable to understand the words of Jesus and drag himself into the light. Our relationship with God is all too often just like that. It is quite common for us to catch a glimpse of the light, only for us to creep back into the darkness of sin. We recognise that Jesus is speaking the truth, and that that truth is spoken with love. But we love ourselves more than we love God. In his letter to the Ephesians, St Paul tells us that God lavishes his GRACE upon us to bring us into the light. Grace is a free gift, poured lovingly on us, helping us as "Children of God" to dwell in the light of truth and love.
