YOU CAN MAKE DONATIONS BY CARD

We have a new machine called **DONA** in the entrance hall to enable donations to be made by debit or credit card. Just tap on the screen to reveal the donation categories (e.g. Offertory, Second Collection, Clergy Support Fund etc). The first time you use DONA you will be asked for some basic identification details. After that a donation can be made in seconds. You can use it to **Gift Aid** your weekly and all other donations if you are a tax payer. It means St Catherine's can claim back from the Tax Office a further 25% of your donation. It makes sense. We will still have a cash collection but some of you will prefer to use **DONA**.

WHAT IS THE SECRET OF ETERNAL YOUTH!?

Scientists have been working away for centuries to discover the secret of eternal youth. The Catholic Church has had the answer for 2000 years. Has it shared the secret with you? Yes. It is Confession of your sins. It is reconciliation with God - not once in a lifetime, not once a year, but as often as is necessary to rejuvenate us by removing the heavy burden of our sins, such a heavy burden on our backs that we buckle under the weight. After Confession, one can see people visibly gain strength and even look younger; there is a glow of peace shining from their faces. Their very body language alters. Not only do we love ourselves again with a clear conscience, but we love the people around us more. We make no judgements; we make allowances for our brothers and sisters. And yet the devil - and many non-Catholics - try to shatter your confidence in this Sacrament and dissuade you from coming to Confession. They scoff at the critical role of the priest to whom Jesus through the Apostles gave the power to forgive sins. If this healing Sacrament is the secret of eternal youth, it is also the secret of eternal life, because we humble ourselves before God. We are honest with ourselves and with God. We love truth and truth enables love. We've had enough of deceiving ourselves and others. We cannot deceive God. So just as Jesus obeyed the will of the Father, so we die to self every time we confess our sins in humility as many of you already do as you strive to live a holy life as children of God. Jesus shows us the way: "I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.' (John 12:20-30). This is the new covenant of which God speaks in Jeremiah (31:31-34). "Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, "Learn to know the Lord!" No, they will all know me . . . since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind." And the new law, the NEW COVENANT God speaks of is Christ's selfsacrifice, his teaching, his Sermon on the Mount, his Beatitudes, as once again this Lent we hear in Psalm 50, "A pure heart create for me, O God." My brothers and sisters: "Learn to know the Lord!" Have we done that properly, or are we going to abandon Jesus at the first sound of gunfire? I invite you to join me on a journey of faith most Thursday evenings at 6 pm starting on 18 April so that together we might "learn to know the Lord" still more!
