THIS IS HOLY WEEK THE MOST IMPORTANT AND THOUGHT-PROVOKING WEEK IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

PALM SUNDAY – PASSION SUNDAY - usual Mass times. Jesus rides on a donkey into Jerusalem and is cheered by ecstatic crowds. By Friday he was crucified. We will hear the Gospel Passion Narrative of St Mark (Year B).

MAUNDY THURSDAY 8 pm – Mass of the Lord's Passover Supper at which Jesus washed the feet of the Apostles to signify that he came to serve, not to be served. Fr Peter will be washing the feet of twelve men at the Maundy Mass to indicate priestly service to the people, after which we will celebrate Christ's institution both of the Holy Eucharist and the Sacred Priesthood. The transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose in the Sacred Heart Chapel and the "stripping of the altar" ends the service. There will be a period of adoration until Compline (Night Prayer) at 10 pm.

GOOD FRIDAY – will begin at **9.30 am** at St Mary's CofE church with a **Walk of Witness** with our Anglican and Methodist brothers and sisters (see below). The **Good Friday Catholic service** marking the Passion and Crucifixion of our Lord Jesus will be at **3 pm** at which the Gospel Passion Narrative of St John will be read, followed by Universal Prayers of Intercession, the Veneration of the Cross, and the distribution of Holy Communion (but it is not a Mass). There will be **Stations of the Cross** at 7.30 pm.

HOLY SATURDAY – Vigil Mass of the Lord's Resurrection – 8 pm. This will begin with the Liturgy of the Light of Christ outside the church, followed by the Easter Proclamation, several readings from Scripture, and after the homily prayers and encouragement for those under sacramental instruction to become Catholics.

EASTER SUNDAY – 8 am and 10 am (no 6 pm Mass)

This is a stunning sequence of events in our faith and I urge you all to participate at the services.

TRY TO COME TO ALL THE SERVICES – IT IS A PILGRIMAGE IN ITSELF. TRY NOT TO WORK IN HOLY WEEK IF AT ALL POSSIBLE! MAKE AN OFFERING OF YOURSELF TO GOD. USE IT AS A RETREAT. PRAY IN SILENCE. PRAY TOGETHER. SPEND TIME BY YOUR CRUCIFIX. ENTER INTO THE MYSTERY OF CHRIST'S CONQUEST OF SIN AND DEATH THROUGH HIS RESURRECTION! GO TO CONFESSION. BE HEALED. LOVE ON ANOTHER.

REFLECTION THIS HOLY WEEK

My dear brothers and sisters, you can just feel how the atmosphere changes from Palm Sunday. We feel with great **anticipation and dread what** awaits us as disciples of our dear Lord Jesus Christ. He has gathered us together **to witness** to the world his great works, and we are happy, but at the same time **to witness** his great sacrifice – an innocent subjected to horrible suffering for us; God, who emptied himself to share in our humanity and to die for us.

I am so pleased that we are gathered here together, to comfort one another. Today we **do** rejoice that Jesus has entered Jerusalem in glory — so many people were transformed by the healing he brought through his love and his truth. His teaching and his compassion and example.

But he knew what lay ahead, that he would be betrayed and handed over to the Jewish authorities who would hand him over to the brutality of the Romans. We are gathered together in sadness. We prepare for our hearts to be broken; for tears to well up in our eyes as the week progresses, because we know that we continue to offend God and harm each other with our sins because we know that we could not have done any better than the Apostles who all but one abandoned Jesus at his hour of need unable to stay up and pray with him in the garden of Gethsemene in his Passion, nowhere to be seen at the Crucifixion, initially doubters at his Resurrection.

I could of course try to lift our spirits right away and say "but don't be sad – the resurrection is on its way." But I am not going to do that.

FIRST WE NEED TO TAKE IN THE ENORMITY OF THE IMPACT OF OUR SINS AND OF THE SUFFERING ENDURED BY CHRIST TO SAVE US FROM SIN AND DEATH. My dear brothers and sisters, for now let us love and support one another in our hour of sadness and remorse.
