Sacrament of Marriage – please speak to Fr Peter at least six months before the proposed wedding date.

Sacrament of Healing - It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Please try to give notice if at all possible and don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic.

Sacrament of Ordination and consecration to the sacred Priesthood and Religious life - please speak to Fr Peter who will connect you with our vocations director.

ARE WE TODAY TRUE WITNESSES TO THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS?

The Resurrection was not an idea in the minds of Christ's followers. It was a physical and bodily resurrection. It was fact witnessed by hundreds. Almost all the Apostles and countless disciples, male and female, died martyrs (= witnesses) rather than deny the resurrection. They were convinced. How can we be witnesses today to the resurrection when we did not see the risen Christ with our own eyes? Jesus said: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." (John 20:28-29) We can become witnesses in two ways. First, MEDITATE AND PRAY we can meditate on the Scriptures; on our faith and on the teachings of the Church handed down from the Apostles. Jesus himself was at pains to explain that the Scriptures of the Old Testament – the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms - all foretold not only his coming but the very nature of his coming on earth - that the Christ must suffer terribly and die before then rising from the dead on the third day (CCC 646, 659). This all made sense to all his followers after the resurrection. Secondly, ACT - always keep and live the truth of the commandments and the sacraments for all the world to see. Proclaim the greatness of the Lord; go to Mass; go to confession; be married in Church; encourage priests and religious vocations. LIVE IN AND DIE IN THE SACRAMENTAL LIFE
