It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick. It can be administered at church, in hospital, care home, at home, indeed anywhere. Make sure you are anointed before an operation with general anaesthetic.

REFLECTION THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD JESUS Did Jesus decide to work from home!?

We celebrated the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ to Heaven last Thursday. Did he really abandon his Apostles to work from home !? Far from it! He ascended not to distance himself from us but to send us the Holy Spirit to guide us to him. Christ, in his risen and glorified body, ascended into heaven forty days after the Resurrection. The image of sitting at the right hand of the Father, which we say also in the Creed, echoes Psalm 110:1, and is mentioned in Acts (2:33) and Mark (16:19). It signifies the universal and eternal rule of the Messiah prophesied in the Book of Daniel (7:14). The Apostles witnessed the moment of the Ascension with their own eyes (Mark 16:19; Luke 24:51, Acts 1:1-11). It is a historical fact, just as they had seen and touched the risen Christ. But what does the Ascension signify? It signifies that God the Son, Jesus Christ, fully God and fully human, the Word made flesh, has taken our humanity into what we call the Godhead, into the relationship of love and truth that is the Holy Trinity. That shows us just how precious we are to God, that our very human nature, created by God in his own image and redeemed by Christ, is now fully absorbed into God for all time. The Ascension is our own exaltation, because we have been deemed worthy as Christ's disciples and "friends" (John 15:15) to be united with God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit into eternity. As St Paul says in Ephesians (4:13): "In this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself." That does not mean every human being is automatically saved from death and sin and will be united with God. Our co-operation, our faith, our selfless love of God and of one another is still required. An act of will is still required both to acknowledge and to live the truth and love of Christ in humility. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God" (Mt 5:8). The Ascension is a necessary prelude to the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost which we celebrate next Sunday, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, and who through our Baptism guides us through this world to the incarnate, crucified, risen and ascended Christ in God's heavenly kingdom. ABORTION LAW – WRITE TO YOUR MP

MPs will have the opportunity to change the UK's abortion law on May 15. Amendments to the Criminal Justice Bill include two to tighten up the law and two to decriminalise abortion.

Under the 1967 Abortion Act, the procedure is permitted in certain circumstances up to 24 weeks of gestation (about six months of pregnancy). The law further allows abortion up to birth if the mother's life is at risk or if the baby has any disability, including Down's syndrome, cleft lip, and clubbed foot. Campaigners say the upper limit places the UK's limit far outside the average cut-off in most countries across Europe, including France, where the upper limit is 14 weeks, and Germany, where it is 12 weeks.

The **first amendment** is proposed by Conservative MP **Caroline Ansell** which would lower the upper limit from 24 weeks to 22 weeks. Her proposal reflects medical advancements within the last 50 years which allow babies to survive with support if born alive at 22 weeks, but this would save only hundreds of more than 200,000 foetuses aborted in the England and Wales each year.

A **second amendment**, proposed by Conservative MP **Liam Fox**, would amend the law to protect children with Down's syndrome from discrimination because of their condition.

A **third amendment**, tabled by Labour MP **Diana Johnson** would in-effect decriminalise abortion up to birth, by removing laws which prevent women from selfperforming abortions after 24 weeks gestation.

The **fourth amendment** – the most dangerous – has been tabled by Labour MP **Stella Creasy** which has the effect of decriminalising abortion completely and allowing abortion to take place right up to birth. We already have one of the most liberal and ruthless abortion regimes in the world.

<u>ACTION</u>: Our Archbishop John Wilson of Southwark has asked us to write to MPs to ask them to vote against the Labour pro-abortion amendments. *With thanks to the Catholic Herald for some of the above information.*
