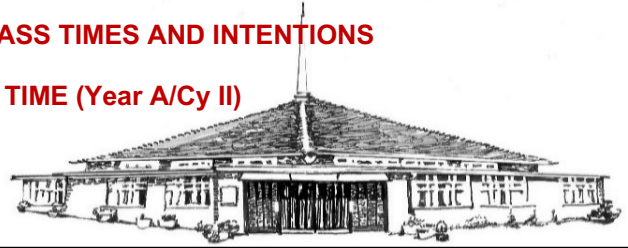

Sacrament of Anointing / Healing – It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick, including those suffering from mental illness, anxiety and dementia. Do make sure you are anointed before an operation under a general anaesthetic.

Sacrament of Ordination and consecration to the sacred Priesthood and Religious life – please speak to Fr Peter.

TODAY IS PEACE SUNDAY

We are called to renew our faith constantly. Holy Mass is the most important and vital means of renewal. It also enables us to go out into the world to work for peace – not just any peace, but the **VERY SPECIAL PEACE** of Christ (**"Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, MY peace I give you"**). Violence, power, harmful substances, corrupting music, films and literature, and all manner of lustful bodily behaviour will only serve to weaken and even destroy us on the journey. Young people are especially at risk, because they may not yet have experienced the full destructive power of sin. Christ's proclamation of the kingdom of God – "repent and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:15) – at the start of his preaching ministry is our call to daily renewal. It enables us to discover God's will for us and how to implement it. We too, like the Corinthians in the Letter of Paul today, are called to be the holy people of Jesus Christ, and indeed a light among nations to bring peace to the world. We can do it, if we truly love Jesus and his teachings and genuinely want to do the will of God – the only thing that can make us happy in this world, and indeed the next. Can we all truly say this?
