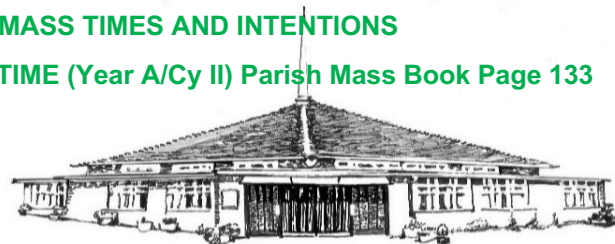

Sacrament of Marriage – please speak to Fr Peter at least six months before the proposed wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing / Healing – It is our duty to call a priest to anoint family members in failing health. Don't leave it to the last minute. It brings consolation to the dying as well as healing to the sick, including those suffering from mental illness, anxiety and dementia. Do make sure you are anointed before an operation under a general anaesthetic.

Sacrament of Ordination and consecration to the sacred Priesthood and Religious life – please speak to Fr Peter.

THE LIGHT OF CHRIST THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT JESUS NOW CALLS US TO SACRIFICE OURSELVES IN GENEROSITY TO ONE ANOTHER

Last week we noted that more than any other passage in the Bible the Beatitudes give us the most profound, intense, sustained and challenging experience of a heavenly existence bathed in pure love and truth – an existence **we are challenged to start experiencing here on earth to prepare for eternal union with God** when we die. Today using the theme of light Jesus continues to explain to us who we are and how we must behave now as Children of God, as children of the light. Jesus tells his disciples:

- **You are the salt of the earth**
- **You are the light of the world**

Let's not pride ourselves that God has somehow given us this mission to bring Christ to others. Jesus is the light of the world and it is this light which we receive at Baptism which helps us to do God's will in this life. Through the example of his own self sacrifice, Jesus has made us "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world." Now we must continue his work. And it can be hazardous work. We were reminded last week that one man who had all these qualities – John the Baptist – was beheaded for speaking the truth to others. It made them uncomfortable. Nonetheless, we are commanded by the Lord to sacrifice our lives to help others to know Jesus, the Light of the world, because he is truly God and truly human and has saved us from sin and death. It does not matter what our role in life may be. **We must all accept self-sacrifice to care generously for others through good works – that we may glorify the Lord by bringing knowledge of him to others.**
